Physical events had to be put on hold, but this did not stop us. We moved all our 'dropin surgeries' to online events and had a record number of attendees.

In the summer we launched a new awards scheme, to recognise Brackmills staff, and in September we recruited a new Police Community Support Officer who, along with our other security measures including additional security, helped us secure a safe Christmas.

Roads

The BID provided more than £31,000 of funding to resurface part of Caswell Road, between the main Gateway roundabout and Festo roundabout, with support from Northamptonshire Highways. It was split in several places.



Utilities

Cables lying near to the top of estate verges were in danger of being damaged due to lorries turning and hitting verges. The BID funded near £25,000 of extra protection along Caswell Road to protect critical utilities.

Flood prevention

In May 2019 there was a flood on the estate that adversely affected 18 businesses. The BID commissioned a flood report and is continuing to lobby and ensure the improvements recommended in the flood prevention report are followed through such as digging the pond deeper (this took place in July 2020).

Winter gritting

We funded 76 applications of gritting, to keep the estate moving and in business during cold and frosty times. The winter gritting season is still underway at the time of writing but at the end of December 2020 57 had been undertaken.

Transport

Electrical scooters are now on Brackmills, a scheme run by Voi in connection with Northamptonshire County Council. This cost effect mode of transport means it has never been easier to get on, off or around the estate. In the first few months, since the launch, 1,430 rides were taken on Brackmills (1% of the total rides in Northampton) and 408 unique riders in the area.



CRIME PREVENTION AND SAFETY

Work closely with the Police and others to maintain a safe and secure working environment for freight transport, all vehicles, customers, and the people who work on the estate.

PCSO

In September we waved goodbye to Ian Taylor, the estate's Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) for the past nine years and welcomed our new dedicated PCSO, Paul Hurst, Paul. who in 2019 won the **Hughes Cup PCSO of** the year for his work around Earls Barton, is doing an excellent job and will continue to play a key role on the estate in the year ahead.

CCTV

The BID continued to maintain and upgrade the 21 cameras, which are strategically placed across the estate. The CCTV Control team work closely with the Police and the estate management team.

ENVIRONMENT AND IMAGE

Summer and winter landscaping

Additional landscaping is performed on the estate during the year to include roundabout maintenance and litter picking (this is over and above the services undertaken by Northampton Borough Council).



Cycle ways and paths

Overhanging branches were lopped, and the verges tidied up, to ensure safe and easy to navigate cycle ways and footpaths.

The BID works with two different contractors – one for grass cutting and another for more specific landscaping projects.

Litter bins

The BID has more than 50 bins on the estate that are collected once or twice weekly. The BID's dedicated PCSO monitors bins to ensure they are not overflowing. Where they are, he reports these issues to the council, to ensure they are promptly emptied.



BUSINESS GROWTH AND INVESTMENT

Support businesses on Brackmills to grow, develop and invest by creating a great working environment.

Website – The BID website **www.brackmillsindustrialestate.co.uk** is constantly being refreshed during the year and now includes a searchable business directory, online jobs fair, Discover Brackmills page and much more.

Communications - To keep everyone up to date on the estate we have regular e-newsletter and business alerts. We also keep everyone connected via our social media channels – Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn.

Drop-in Surgeries – Covid meant the BID had to postpone all face-to-face meetings, so instead it has held monthly 'surgeries', in partnership with the University of Northampton, for businesses and employees across the estate to ask questions, share their news, and seek support.

Training, skills, and recruitment – In the autumn, in response to requests for support from businesses on the estate, we launched our all-new Brackmills Virtual Jobs Fair. Within days of going live this online portal was promoting more than 1,500 jobs across the estate – and we were able to match job hunters with businesses seeking to attract new talent and fill both part and full-time positions. Thank you to all the recruitment companies and businesses that promoted their vacancies, many providing mini films that we uploaded to our online portal - https://brackmillsindustrialestate.co.uk/virtual-jobs-fair

Covid testing – Brackmills hosted a Covid testing unit for six weeks, testing hundreds of people - most were employees on the estate or nearby residents. The BID also linked with the University of Northampton and Public Health Northamptonshire to run a host of Covid-relevant events, including ones which focused on mental health and wellbeing.

Funding and grants - Throughout the lockdowns BID Chief Executive Sara Homer supported dozens of businesses on the estate seeking help. Some were struggling to apply for a business grant, while others were desperately seeking an update on their application. Sara and the BID team were able to liaise directly with Northampton Borough Council to help.

Promoting our units – The BID continues to work with several partners, including property developers, to promote newly built and vacant units.



PAYING YOUR BID LEVY

Businesses in the Brackmills Industrial Estate BID area are required to pay a levy, which is in addition to Business Rates and needs to be paid separately (regardless of how you pay your Business Rates).

Prompt payment will help ensure that the objectives that were voted on in the BID Business Plan come to fruition
